## From M1 Motorway to the Brian Clough Car Park

Leave the M1 at Junction 24, continue along A453 past the Power Station. Stay on this road for approximately 5 miles and you will eventually come to a roundabout with the Crusader Public House on the left hand side. Go straight across following directions for Nottingham.

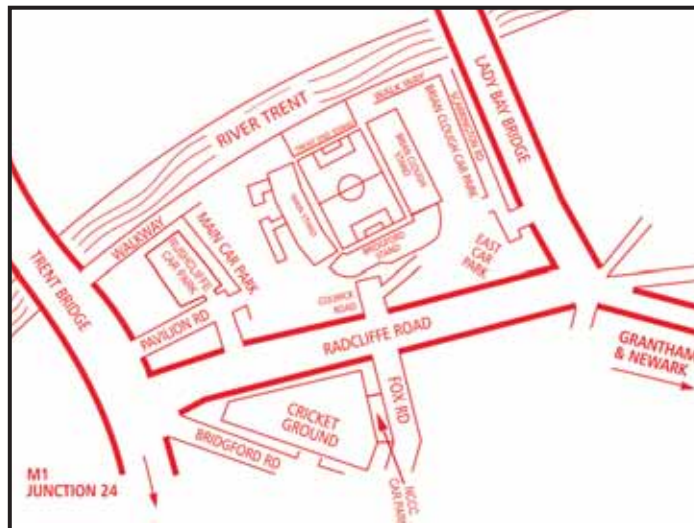
Continue along this road, passing Nottingham Trent University Clifton Campus also on your left. Go straight on at the traffic lights ahead and continue for another 300 yards before taking the slip road off to the left signed Newark, West Bridgford. Take the first left at the roundabout.

Continue along this road going over a mini roundabout and several sets of traffic lights before coming to a large T junction. Turn left on to London Road and get into the right hand lane.

At the Mercedes garage on the right filter into the right hand slip lane. Go through the first set of traffic lights and bear round to the right through the next set of lights on to Radcliffe Road.

Continue along Radcliffe road passing a Toyota garage on your left, take the left hand lane as you approach the traffic lights. Turn left onto Lady Bay Bridge. After just 100 yards turn left into Scarrington Road and the ground is situated ahead of you. The Executive Suite is located in the Brian Clough Stand accessible from the Brian Clough Car Park.

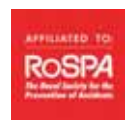

The HSE has established a Disease Reduction Programme (DRP) as part of the FIT3 (fit for work, fit for life, fit for tomorrow). The aim of DRP is to achieve a significant reduction in the incidence (new cases) of work-related ill health caused by exposure to hazardous substances.

Work-related dermatitis accounts for a significant proportion of work-related ill health. Employers, managers, and safety professionals are expected to play key roles in preventing work-related dermatitis.
